A Message from the Windsor Township Board of Supervisors

2012 is proving to be an eventful year with many changes coming to the Township.

This newsletter is the first one to go paperless. A paper copy was sent only to those residents who returned the coupon or contacted the Township Office with their name and address. The newsletter is available for downloading on our website (www.windsortwp.com).

For approximately a year, the Windsor Township Planning Commission and Township staff have been working with The ARRO Group and Thomas Comitta Associates to rewrite the Zoning Ordinance. The draft should be finalized shortly. Once the Zoning Ordinance has been adopted, work will begin on rewriting the Subdivision & Land Development Ordinance. Keep tuned to future newsletters for more information.

The Act 537 Plan has been approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection and the On-Lot Disposal System (OLDS) Management Ordinance has been adopted. The Township has been divided into four (4) districts with a different district being selected each year on a rotating schedule. All of the property owners with a septic system within the selected district will be notified that their septic system will need to be pumped out.

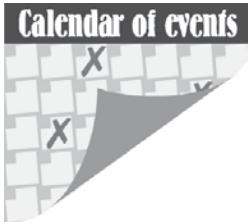

Zoning Ordinance

Windsor Township has been working on a comprehensive amendment of its Zoning Ordinance since early 2011. The Zoning Ordinance creates zones in the Township where regulations are provided for all types of development such as residential, commercial, and industrial. In addition, the ordinance establishes development densities and provisions outlining the protection/conservation of existing natural features. At the time of this newsletter's publication, the Planning Commission will have presented the County and the Board of Supervisors with a final draft of the Ordinance. Copies will be available for review at the Township office. The tentative adoption date for the Ordinance is October 2012. Stay tuned to the Township's website, the newspaper, and postings if you are interested in the process.

West Nile Virus

This summer, there have been multiple mosquitoes found in the Township that have tested positive for West Nile Virus. West Nile Virus is transmitted by infected mosquitoes which become infected after biting infected wild birds. After an incubation period of ten (10) to fourteen (14) days, an infected mosquito can transmit the virus to both humans and animals while feeding on them.

Mosquito species found in York County require at least seven (7) days to complete their life cycle from egg to emerging adult. If a water source dries up within 72 hours, it will not breed mosquitoes. Any item that can hold or collect shallow amounts of water may be potential sources for breeding mosquitoes. Help to eliminate sources where mosquitoes can breed by following these tips:

- Arrange tarps to avoid puddles. Empty after rains.
Store unused tarps under cover.
- Clean gutters, even in the summer.
- Store flower pots, buckets and plastic toys inside.
- Drill holes in the bottom of garbage and recycling cans.
- Clean bird baths weekly.
- Dispose of waste tires properly.
- Screen rain barrels completely. Treat the water with bacterial larvicide.
- Aerate fish ponds and fountains and stock fish in them.
- Properly maintain swimming pools. Drain covers.
Clean kiddie pools weekly.
- Keep trash and litter cleaned up in your community.
- Make sure boats are stored with covers taut.

Act 537 Plan and On-Lot Disposal System (OLDS) Management Ordinance

In previous newsletters, there have been articles regarding the preparation of an Official Comprehensive Sewage Facilities Plan (Act 537 Plan) for the Township. The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection approved the Township's Act 537 Plan in May of this year. As part of the plan, an On-Lot Disposal System (OLDS) Management Program was required to be implemented. In July, the Windsor Township Board of Supervisors adopted an OLDS Ordinance requiring the pump out of septic systems.

The Township is being split into four (4) districts with a different district being selected each year on a rotating schedule. Each property owner in that district with a septic system will receive a letter from the Township advising that their septic tanks have to be pumped and inspected by a licensed septic hauler. A list of York County Solid Waste Authority licensed septic haulers will be provided. The hauler will then provide the Township with documentation that your septic system was pumped. To facilitate the pumping, property owners may have to make improvements to their systems for access and inspection. The estimated cost for the installation of an inspection port is between \$100.00 and \$450.00. A permit will also be required from the Township Sewage Enforcement Officer (SEO). The cost of the permit is \$100.00, which includes the permit and inspection by the SEO.

Due to the way cesspools were constructed years ago, those properties with a cesspool will not be required to have it pumped. However, it must still have a walk over inspection by the SEO every four (4) years to ensure that it is functioning properly. The cost of the inspection is \$100.00.

CRIME PREVENTION OFFICER OF THE YEAR — Officer Peter C. Montgomery

Officer Peter C. Montgomery of the York Area Regional Police Department was named the Pennsylvania Crime Prevention Officer of the Year on July 10, 2012. Governor Tom Corbett joined with the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency and the Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police Association in thanking and commending Officer Montgomery in a letter and plaque presented at the Awards Ceremony. The Officer was recognized for his exceptional efforts toward educating and involving his community in effective, long-lasting Crime Prevention strategies. Officer Montgomery was also recognized with a Senate Resolution sponsored by Senators Patricia H. Vance and Michael L. Waugh and a Citation by the House of Representatives sponsored by Representative Scott Perry.

Retirement — Officer Charles M. Ruth joined the York Township Police Department February 16, 1981, after serving as an officer with the Dallastown Borough Police Department. Officer Ruth retired from the York Area Regional Police Department on June 18, 2012, after over 33 years of police service.

Officer Ruth attended York College of Pennsylvania and received his police training at the Pennsylvania State Police Academy. Officer Ruth completed the intensive training required to become a D.A.R.E. (Drug Abuse Resistance Education) officer in 1997 and served for 10 years as a D.A.R.E. officer in the Dallastown Schools. In 2004, Officer Ruth was assigned as a School Resource Officer in the Red Lion Junior High School and has served there for the past eight years. Officer Ruth has received numerous letters of appreciation and awards including eight departmental commendations and the department's second highest award, the Medal of Distinction.

Retirement — Lieutenant Paul C. Redifer joined the Windsor Township Police Department on May 22, 1983, and will be retiring from the York Area Regional Police Department on September 28, 2012, after more than 29 years of service. Lt. Redifer was a

graduate of the Pennsylvania State Police Academy and also was a certified Firearms Instructor and Polygraph Operator. He served as the Coordinator of the York County D.U.I. Enforcement program for over twenty years and was the recipient of numerous letters of appreciation and Departmental awards including three Chief's Commendations. Lt. House Numbers

If you should need the services of an ambulance, fire company or police, could they find you?

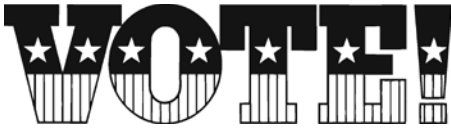
In July of 1994, the Township adopted an ordinance to help them. **The ordinance requires house numbers to be posted near each driveway on your property.** The minimum

dimensions of the house number are not less than two (2) inches wide and four (4) inches high.

This helps them be legible and easily visible from the street.

If you share a driveway, each address must be posted at the driveway and at each individual property.

Freysville Intersection

It was a long time coming but construction and installation of the traffic signal is complete at the intersection of Windsor and Freysville Roads. The traffic signal began full operation on June 12, 2012. Thank you for your consideration and courtesy to the construction crew.

A frequently asked question is why are there left turn lanes but not arrows. The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation regulations have a set number of left turns that must occur within a set time period. The number of left turns at the intersection did not meet the criteria to require arrows.



Soliciting and Peddling Ordinance

In September of 2011, the Township adopted a Soliciting and Peddling Ordinance that requires people who are selling goods to obtain a permit in order to do so. If someone comes to your door, ask to see their Solicitation and Peddling License. They are required to carry the license upon their person at all times and exhibit it upon request by you. The ordinance states that if the resident displays a "No Solicitation" sign at their premises, it is unlawful for a solicitor or peddler to enter the premises for purposes of soliciting or peddling.

The York Area Regional Police Department is to be contacted at 9-1-1 should you encounter someone violating the ordinance.

HELP ELIMINATE LITTER AND ILLEGAL DUMPSITES

York County residents, organizations, civic groups, schools and neighborhoods that want to clean up litter or eliminate illegal dumpsites can dispose of waste from a clean-up effort free of charge at the York County Resource Recovery Center operated by the York County Solid Waste Authority.

The Authority is working with Keep York County Beautiful to stop illegal dumping in our community and clean up existing dumpsites. If you are looking for a site to help clean, call Tom Smith at Keep York County Beautiful at 717-840-2375 or email him at tls35@psu.edu.

Uncover Fire Hydrants

During snow storms, the fire hydrants become covered with snow or have snow pushed against them. If there is a fire hydrant on your property, please shovel around it so that the fire company can get access to it should there be a fire in your neighborhood. Also, all of the fire hydrants should be marked with a whip antenna so that they are easy to locate. If it is missing, let us know.

Thank you for helping to make the fire company's job a little easier.

Mailbox Policy

We are asking for your help to reduce the possibility of a broken mailbox or post. The Highway Department employees are very careful and take precautions to avoid hitting mailbox posts. However, during a storm, visibility is greatly reduced, making it difficult for a driver to see a mailbox in time to avoid striking it or pushing it over with plowed snow. Posts and mailboxes should be checked for deterioration and replaced, if necessary, to reduce the possibility of damage from the weight of the plowed snow.

Any installation in the road right-of-way, including mailboxes and fences, is placed there at the owner's risk. The Township will not replace these items unless they have been physically struck by the truck and/or snow plow.

SNOW EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

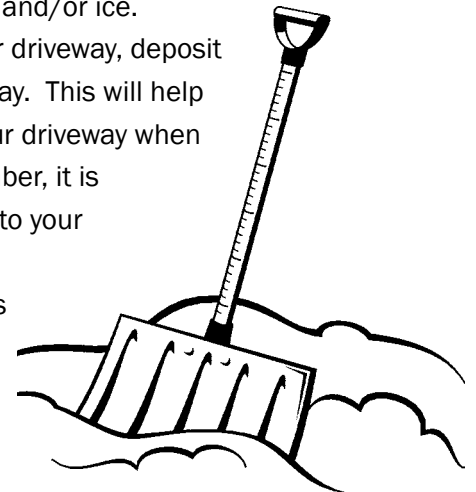
Before you know, it cold weather and snow will be here. All of the Township roads have been posted with Snow Emergency signs. The Snow Emergency Ordinance allows for a snow emergency to be declared. The Township will only declare a snow emergency when substantial amounts of snow/ice are predicted. Once a snow emergency has been declared, it will be announced on local television stations. All vehicles are to be removed from the street during a snow emergency. If they are not removed, the vehicles are subject to being towed or a fine of not less than \$50 but not more than \$1000 plus the cost of prosecution. An amendment to the Snow Emergency Ordinance allows for the towing fees to be assessed upon the dispatch of a tow truck. The cost to retrieve your vehicle from the towing company could range from \$75.00 to \$100.00 or more depending on the length of time they hold it. The declaration of a snow emergency allows the Highway Department to remove snow from the streets without having to weave in and out of parked vehicles. It also eliminates the need to return to the development to remove the snow where the vehicles had been parked.

The Snow Emergency Ordinance also requires that snow/ice be removed from sidewalks along a street within 24 hours after the snow has ceased to fall and/or the ice to have formed regardless of whether an emergency was declared or not. Penalties will be assessed for violations. It is not the Township's wish to file charges against property owners. So your prompt attention to the removal of snow/ice from the sidewalks is appreciated.

Every year we get calls that a neighbor has **shoveled/blown the snow from their driveway or sidewalk onto the street**. Article III, Section A of the Snow Emergency Ordinance prohibits the dumping, shoveling or placement of any snow and/or ice on a public street. A fine of not less than \$50 and not more than \$1000 plus the cost of prosecution is not worth it when there are other areas to dispose of the snow and/or ice.

When shoveling out the end of your driveway, deposit the snow to the right side of the driveway. This will help to avoid the snow coming back into your driveway when the plow comes to your street. Remember, it is impossible to not have snow pushed into your driveway.

Woody Waste Drop-off and Curbside Collection

The Township is still offering a drop-off location for woody waste. The woody waste drop-off will take place the 2nd Saturday of selected months from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. at the Public Works Building located at 970 White Oak Rd., Windsor. The drop-off dates for 2012 and the beginning of 2013 are as follows:

September 8
October 13
December 8
March 9
April 13
June 8
July 13

The drop-off is for residential woody waste only. Our employees will be on hand to assist with unloading the woody waste. **This service is available to Township residents only. Photo identification will be required.** There is a six (6) ft. length limit. Woody waste brought to the drop off location **does not** need to be bundled. **NO commercial businesses. NO grass clippings, tree stumps, sawdust, mulch or flower debris.**

The Township will continue to provide a **curbside woody waste collection** during the months of May and November. The next curbside collection is scheduled for the week of November 5, 2012, on the same day as your regular trash collection. This collection will deal with brush and tree trimmings only.

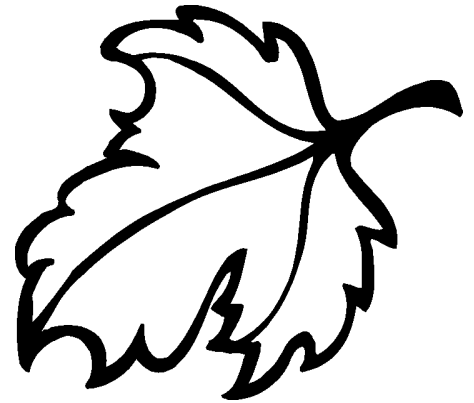
- The trimmings must be bundled and **tied with twine** in 4 ft. lengths or placed in a biodegradable bag. Biodegradable bags are sold at most home improvement stores. Woody waste may be considered contaminated if it is bundled with anything other than twine or is mixed with other types of solid waste. Contaminated woody waste would then have to be considered municipal waste and would require disposal at the incinerator. This of course would defeat the benefits of recycling woody waste.
- Material should be one quarter to three inches in diameter.
- There is no limit to the number of “qualifying” bundles or bags that can be placed out for collection.
- **NO TRIMMINGS IN GARBAGE BAGS OR CANS.**
- **NO GRASS CLIPPINGS.**
- **NO TREE STUMPS.**

What to do with Grass Clippings?

Best option: Use a mulching mower and let your grass clippings work for you. Mulched grass provides moisture and nitrogen to keep your lawn looking great. If you don't have a mulching mower, low cost conversion kits are available that fit most mowers. Another idea: Place grass clippings on your vegetable garden or around your hedges. Create a backyard compost bin. There are many varieties in stores or you can make a bin of your own. Last resort: Place grass clippings in your regular trash. The bags containing grass clippings will count toward the four (4) bag limit.

Compact Fluorescent Light (CFL) Bulb Recycling

Just a reminder that CFL bulbs can still be brought to the Township Office for recycling. Bring your unbroken CFLs to the Township Office during normal business hours and we will take it from there. Sorry, we cannot accept tube fluorescent bulbs. This is only for CFL bulbs.



Leaf Collection

Leaf collection will run from October 15 through December 7, 2012. The Township uses a leaf collector that is self contained and is operated by one person. This eliminates the need for rakers. Remember to rake leaves as close to the edge of the blacktop/curb as possible in narrow rows away from fences, posts, poles or cars. Tree limbs, grass, shrubs and hedge trimmings, bricks, stones or any foreign objects are **not** to be deposited in the leaves. If foreign objects are found, the leaves will not be collected.

FALL CLEANUP

Large item pick-up will be held the week of **September 24, 2012**. All items must be out at the curb by 6:00 a.m. on your regular trash collection day. It is suggested that items be placed at the curb the night before your collection day. York Waste Disposal will not return to pick up items that are placed at the curb after they have gone through. **THIS COLLECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO THE TOWNHOUSES IN WINDSOR COMMONS APARTMENTS AND LION'S GATE (FORMERLY WINDSOR POINTE).**

Remember to place your large pickup items away from the regular trash and recycling.

ITEMS WHICH **WILL** BE COLLECTED PER HOUSEHOLD:

1. Three (3) large items from the following:
 - a. Furniture (sofa, mattress, chair, etc.)
 - b. White goods (stove, water heater, etc.)
 - c. Large glass (storm window, etc.)
2. Carpet – rolled, tied in 4 ft. lengths
3. Maximum of two (2) tires, **off rims**. (No large truck tires)

ITEMS WHICH **WILL NOT** BE COLLECTED:

1. Construction debris (drywall, tile, shingles, bricks, etc.)
2. Batteries and automobile parts
3. Hazardous materials (Pesticides, propane tanks, etc.)
4. Tree stumps and other woody waste

Recycling Program

Our recycling program accepts all of the below listed items as part of the program:

Acceptable Items:

- Aluminum food and beverage containers with food debris removed. **Labels do not need to be removed.**

- Glass food and beverage containers with **lids and food debris removed**: Clear, Brown, Green. **Labels do not need to be removed.**

- Natural and pigmented plastic narrow-neck containers with symbols 1,2,3,4,5,6,7 (milk bottles, water bottles, detergent bottles, shampoo bottles, bleach bottles, etc.) **Lids and food debris removed. Labels do not need to be removed.**

- Ferrous (Iron, steel, tin) cans with **food debris removed**.
- Newsprint – black and white or pigmented.
- Construction paper, craft paper, cereal boxes, shoe boxes, or similar.
- Printer paper, computer paper, copy paper.
- Junk mail.
- Magazines, catalogs.
- Corrugated cardboard cut down small enough to fit into the recycling bin.
- Phone books.



Non-Acceptable Items:

- Window or auto glass, drinking glasses, mirrors
- Light bulbs
- Microwave trays, glass cookware/bake ware
- Plastic bags
- Styrofoam salad/deli containers
- Household items such as cooking pots, appliances and aluminum foil
- Batteries
- Scrap metal

Larger recycling bins are still available. Just stop by the Township Office during normal business hours and pick one up. We are asking that you paint your street number on the bin so that it can be returned to you if it should blow away.

On windy days, place a heavy item on top of the bin such as a brown paper bag of newspapers or magazines. This will help to keep the recycling from blowing around your neighborhood.

MUST I RECYCLE? Yes. Pennsylvania law requires all Windsor Township residential and commercial properties to recycle. All recyclable materials must be removed from the regular trash. This is not only the right thing to do environmentally, but it saves money in disposal costs.

As in the past, recycling should not be put out for collection in plastic grocery bags. It will not be collected.

The recycling program and trash collection are provided to the residents of Windsor Township at NO CHARGE. The cost of collection is paid by Modern Landfill as a part of the Host Municipal Benefit Agreement.

Garbage

Just a reminder that there is a **four (4) bag/container limit** on your weekly trash service. Each bag/container, when filled, may not weigh more than 75 lbs. nor exceed a volume of 32 gallons.

When there is a holiday on a weekday, collection will be one day late after the holiday. The holidays observed by York Waste Disposal are:

- New Year's Day
- Memorial Day
- July 4th (if it is a weekday)
- Labor Day
- Thanksgiving
- Christmas Day

For example: Thanksgiving Day is a Thursday. Therefore, the regular Thursday collection will take place on Friday and the regular Friday collection will take place on Saturday.

Christmas Tree Collection

Christmas may seem like a long way off but it will be here before we know it. Christmas tree collection will be the week of January 7, 2013, on the same day as your regular trash collection. The tree must be free of ornaments, garland and tinsel. **NO PLASTIC BAGS.** The maximum tree height is 6 feet.
