

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WINDSOR,
YORK COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, PROVIDING CURFEW
REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN MINORS IN
WINDSOR TOWNSHIP, MAKING PROVISIONS FOR
THE TIMES DURING WHICH CERTAIN MINORS MAY BE
IN OR UPON CERTAIN PUBLIC PLACES OR ESTABLISHMENTS, AND
RELATING GENERALLY TO A CURFEW REQUIREMENT FOR CERTAIN
MINORS IN THIS TOWNSHIP AND TO THE DUTY OF MINORS, PARENTS,
AND OTHERS IN RELATION THERETO.**

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of Windsor Township, York County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained as follows:

SECTION I – DEFINITIONS

As used in this ordinance, the following terms shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates a different meaning is intended:

Establishment – Any privately owned place of business carried on for a profit or any place of amusement or entertainment to which the public is invited.

Minor – Any person under the age of 18 years.

Official Township Time – Eastern standard time, except from the last Sunday in April to the last Sunday in October during which it shall be Eastern daylight saving time.

Operator – Any individual, firm, association, partnership or corporation operating, managing or conducting any establishment, and whenever used in any clause prescribing a penalty, the term “operator”, as applied to associations or partnerships, shall include the members or partners thereof and, as applied to corporations, shall include the officers thereof.

Public Place – Any public street, highway, road, alley, park, playground, public building or vacant lot.

Remain – To loiter, idle, wander, stroll, play or be in or upon.

SECTION II – UNLAWFUL CONDUCT OF MINORS

- A. No minor shall remain in or upon any public place or any establishment between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m., official township time.
- B. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any minor accompanied by a parent or to a minor upon an errand or other legal business directed by such minor's parent or to any minor who is engaged in gainful lawful employment during the curfew hours.

SECTION III – UNLAWFUL CONDUCT OF OWNERS OR OPERATORS OF ESTABLISHMENTS

- A. No operator of an establishment or their agents or employees shall knowingly permit any minor to remain upon the premises of said establishment between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m. official township time.
- B. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any operator of an establishment or their agents or employees with regard to a minor employed by the operator and engaged in gainful lawful employment by the operator during the curfew hours.

SECTION IV – ENFORCEMENT; VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES


- A. Any police officer who finds a minor violating any provisions of Section II may issue a citation immediately to the minor, constituting a summary violation, and may then take the minor home, if feasible, or may take the minor to police headquarters and request a parent to come to headquarters for the minor.
- B. Any police officer who finds an operator of an establishment or their agent or employees violating any provision of Section III may issue a citation immediately to the operator of the establishment or their agents or employees, constituting a summary violation.
- C. Any minor who shall be adjudged in violation of Section II before a District Justice shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$600 for each violation and costs of prosecution to be collected as other fines and costs are by law collectible, and in default of payment of said fine and costs, the Magistrate shall forward the citation and complaint to York County Juvenile Probation Office.


D. Any operator of an establishment or their agents or employees who shall be adjudged in violation of Section III of this ordinance before a District Justice shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$600 for each violation and costs of prosecution to be collected as other fines and costs are by law collectible, and in default of payment of said fine and costs, the Magistrate shall sentence the operator of the establishment or their agents or employees to imprisonment for not more than 30 days in York County Prison.




